- Support school staff in helping my child develop a sense of respect for others and their belongings
- Assist my child in making sure they are neat and tidy and in school uniform
- Support school staff to improve my child's academic and behavioural success
- Follow visitor procedures by checking in at the main office before going anywhere in the school building or grounds during school hours
- Return phone calls and forms/notes from school in a timely manner
- Make an appropriate time to meet with a teacher when I need a meeting

- Teach and practise good health habits regarding personal hygiene, exercise and nutrition
- Help my child develop alternative, peaceful methods of resolving conflicts
- Make sure my child does not bring disruptive, harmful or illegal things to school
- Teach my child to exit and enter the car on the footpath side
- Make sure my child uses the School Crossing when crossing the road
- Do not walk through or park in the staff car park

- Make sure that my child arrives at school before 8.55am
- Help my child get up in the morning to arrive at school on time
- Help my child go to bed at a reasonable time so they get enough sleep before coming to school
- Encourage my child to eat breakfast before they come to school
- Make sure I contact the school if I am going to be late to pick up my child from school
- Attend Student Led Conferences
- Talk with my child each day about their school activities
- Improve student welfare by becoming part of the School community. Involvement as a classroom parent helper, volunteering for fundraising activities or helping with ground improvements all contribute to providing a better learning environment for our children.

I always

- Find ways to help my child to practise behaviours that will make them responsible and independent
- Read the school newsletter and check the school website to learn information about our school and special events
- Attend parent information activities, community events (e.g. fundraising, working bees) throughout the school year
 - Contact my child's teacher to discuss any issues that may affect their learning and/or welfare
- Provide my child with a quiet place in the home for daily reading and supervise the completion of their homework

The 'Parent Matrix' is designed to assist families at home with supporting our School Wide Positive Behaviour Support Framework. At school, students are expected to follow rules and expectations by displaying the positive values that are displayed on the Student Behaviour Matrix. These are explicitly taught on a weekly basis to teach students *how* to behave in a positive manner to their peers and teachers at school.

In conjunction with the support of School Council, the staff have created a Parent Matrix so parents can demonstrate that they are also following a set of positive guidelines to support their child. As a school, we feel that it is important that students see their parents as a positive part of their education and that they play a role in their schooling success.
