News from Mr Rowland

2021 School Year Now in Full Swing

How fabulous it is to have a full school of 440 students, after extended periods of COVID-19 related 'interruptions' throughout 2020.

Students are very settled across our 19 classes as routines are being established and expectations clarified for all learners. The focus for School Wide Positive Behaviour during the first two weeks has been on what great listeners do – they show the 5Ls. This relates to LEGS crossed, hands in your LAP, LOOKING at the speaker, LIPS locked and attentively LISTENING to the person speaking.

Specialist classes began this week and have already begun to be eagerly embraced.

We remind parents who enter the school grounds and are welcome to do so now, to socially distance or wear a mask – our children are watching and we are role models to them!

Our first whole school assembly will be held MONDAY 8th FEBRUARY at 9:05am outdoors near the flagpoles (weather permitting). A live YouTube stream of assembly will need to be arranged if it is raining and we need to be indoors – a link will be communicated via Compass for this if required. Prep students will join us at Monday morning assemblies in a few weeks, after they have had some more time settling into school and routines. Parents are welcome to our outdoor assemblies but must socially distance and we also ask you to use the QR code to register that you are onsite for more than 15 minutes attending a school function. QR code posters are being placed around the school.

Tutor Learning Initiative Implementation

This Department of Education & Training (DET) initiative is being led by Mr Fleming at Mano during the first half of this year (and Mrs Tickner will support some sessions with Grade 1 students).

Effective implementation of the Tutor Learning Initiative (TLI) is the single most important action for schools to take, to support students whose learning was most impacted by the necessity to move to remote and flexible learning during the 2020 school year.

We have worked carefully to highlight those students in greatest need (based on 2020 classroom teacher advice and 2020 end of year Student Report documented achievement outcomes) and sessions will begin from Monday 8th February. Most students in this program will participate in two sessions per week, with Numeracy the focus in Term 1.

Schools will use a standardised assessment tool of their choice to measure all student's learning, at the start of the TLI and again at the conclusion of the program.

This approach includes students who may join the program later in the year, as well as those who exit the program early because they have caught up more quickly than had been expected.

If you have any questions about TLI at Mano, feel free to contact Mr Fleming or myself.

During the 5th week of this term, starting Monday 22nd February, we are planning to offer a range of Curriculum information sessions for parents (subject to COVID guidelines at the time) and this will be both an opportunity to: meet classroom teachers and to gain a deeper understanding of 2021 curriculum plans and related arrangements. We hope you will join us at these sessions.

Dates are: Monday 22nd Prep, Tuesday 23rd Grade 1 and 2s, Wednesday 24th Middles and Thursday 25th Seniors (all proposed for 6:30-7:30pm).

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) 2021

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school excursions, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. Parents or legal guardians are required to complete a CSEF application form and lodge it with the Office for processing. Application forms should be completed and lodged with **schools by Friday 26th February 2021**, as payments are made from March. However schools will be able to accept and process applications up until the end of Term 2 each year. Contact the office to obtain a CSEF application form

<u>Please ensure a copy of your means-tested concession card is provided with your CSEF application form.</u> If you were eligible and received CSEF in 2020, your application will rollover to 2021 and a new application form is <u>not required</u> to be completed.
