It's not Okay to be Away!: Our school has higher than normal absence rates when compared to the 'State' and 'Similar Schools'. On average, our students had 16.1 days absent in 2022 (compared to 14.9 days for the 'State' and 13.7 days for 'Similar Schools'). As a result of this data, we have begun exploring 'why' and 'how we can improve'. This exploration will include developing an Action Plan to address our higher absent rates. Part of this Action Plan will include promoting regular attendance through our newsletter and Compass.

Regular attendance at school plays a vital role for students to achieve their academic potential, as well as setting up a wonderful foundation for their social and emotional development. We hope the table below highlights the importance of regular attendance to school.

How many days will your child miss this semester?

- This is within the normal range. The child can take 0-6 advantage of the teaching and learning opportunities available to them.
- 7 10 This attendance rate is below average. A child with this attendance rate could miss over one year of schooling between Prep and Year 10.

11-20 This is a poor attendance rate. A child with this attendance rate could miss up to two years of schooling between Prep and Year 10.

To miss two years of school between Prep and Year 10 places significant risk on any student. It goes without saying that regular absenteeism from school won't do your child any favours. Allowing your child to skip days simply because they "don't feel like going to school" should not be an option.

Our school provides support and strategies for families to assist in maintaining regular school attendance. We encourage any 'Starting Right' program and have begun engaging in the family to contact Mrs Mundine (Prep - Gr 2) or Mr Smith (Gr 3 -




Science Technology Engineering Maths (STEM)


It has been wonderful to welcome Mano students to Stem this year and as such they have all been very excited to begin too.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) 2023

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school excursions, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

Parents or legal guardians are required complete a CSEF application form and lodge it with the Office for processing.

Application forms should be completed and lodged with **schools by Monday 27th February 2023**, as payments are made from March. However schools will be able to accept and process applications up until the end of Term 2 each year. Contact the Office to obtain a CSEF application form.

<u>Please ensure a copy of your means-tested concession card is provided with your CSEF application form.</u> If you were eligible and received CSEF in 2022, your application will rollover to 2023 and a new application form is <u>not required</u> to be completed.


WHERE: FYANSFORD COMMON


