#### **NEWS FROM MR SMITH**

Dear School Community Members,

Recently we have been supporting some students and their families managing the use of screen time and the appropriate use of the opportunities available online. With this in mind, I encourage all families to invest time into setting their children up for success in relation to their use of their device, screen time and online opportunities.

Late last year I listened to a Podcast produced by highly acclaimed educator and researcher, Sue Larkey. The Podcast focussed on 'Understanding Screen Addiction'. The Podcast highlighted the challenge many families are experiencing with managing screen time with their children following the extended periods of lockdown over the last three years. Sue Larkey and her guest, Simon Da Roza, provided many tips, ideas and resources that families can consider to support and manage screen time with their children. The Podcast can be found by searching "Sue Larkey – Understanding Screen Addition" in your preferred Podcast platform. The Podcast aligned very closely with a keynote presentation from Susan McLean last year that I wish to share with our families. Susan has spent the last 22 years sharing her stories, knowledge and expertise to keep kids cyber safe. Below is my learning from Susan's session that may assist families when working with their children in managing screen time:

- By the age of 11, the majority of boys have had multiple exposures to Pornographic images and clips
- YouTube is one of the most popular platforms for primary age Please note: children and 90% of 9 year old children have had exposure to 'inappropriate' material on YouTube
- The internet minute it is staggering to see the snapshot of what happens on the internet in a minute (see link:
- https://www.visualcapitalist.com/from-amazon-to-zoom-whathappens-in-an-internet-minute-in-2021/
- Primary aged children don't know life without technology or a 'device' free world
- Devices and technology are here to stay so adults need to learn to embrace 'it' with a balance
- Families are advised to develop their technology (device) agreements underpinned by the 3 R's -Respect, Responsibility and Reputation
- Primary aged children should never be allowed to take their device into their bedroom or bathroom
- Families are often not aware of the impact technology and devices have on their children's quality of sleep - quality sleep is the only time our body and mind 'repairs'
- 52% of requests for nude photos comes from someone they <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=mWe6Z3zFwoA">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=mWe6Z3zFwoA</a> don't know
- If kids perceive you don't like technology, they will never come to you when they have a problem online
- Kids will make mistakes on technology don't ignore these mistakes, but education and forgiveness is the best response
- "Parents need to parent" it is OK to insist our children have a balance with socialisation by providing opportunities to "play at the original Playstation" (see attached images)

How Full is Your Bucket: This week I visited most classes to congratulate them on their successful start to the school year. Part of this visit included reading a book titled, 'How Full is Your Bucket?' The message in this book is the core to a happy and vibrant school community. The 'filling buckets' concept is a guide to daily happiness for kids. I encourage you to discuss 'filling buckets' with your child. An online version of the book is available on YouTube:

NAPLAN: As most of you are aware, NAPLAN (National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy) is a national assessment conducted across Australia for all Yr 3, Yr 5, Yr 7 and Yr 9 students every year. It provides families and schools an indication of where a child is placed in Reading, Writing and Numeracy. Along with a host of other information, the results enable schools and teachers to use the outcomes to inform their practice. To minimise anxiety of students, along with providing students with the support to maximise their result in NAPLAN, all Grade 3 and Grade 5 students will begin preparing for NAPLAN over the next 3 weeks to avoid the preparation being crammed into the week prior. Our Grade 3 and Grade 5 students will partake in whole class, small group and individual activities in this time so they are proficient, comfortable and aware of 'testing' conditions.

Student Learning – Art: Our Art Room has always been a highlight for many Mano students, and this year is no different. Last week I spent some time with Prep J in their weekly Art lesson and I was blown away with the quality of work produced. As you will see in the Art News on page 5, each student completed a 'Self Portrait' that has formed a whole school display in the Library. Apart from the fun and excitement that each Prep J student demonstrated, they learnt the important skills of using shape, line, pattern and space within their artwork.

Staff Professional Learning – Individual Education Plans (IEPs): Led by Mr Beck, this week our staff forum was focused on compiling and implementing high quality Individual Education Plans. An IEP is a written plan that describes the adjustments, goals and strategies to meet a students' individual educational needs so they can reach their full potential. Our staff develop an IEP for approximately 10% of our students. Part of the process in developing an IEP, staff engage both the student and his/her family to gain input into the plan. Ultimately, the plan is co-developed by the teacher, student and the family. This maximises ownership and clarity, and in turn motivation to achieve the goals set in the plan. Teachers will continue the process of developing the IEPs for the selected students and contact families over the coming weeks.

#### **Mano Sports Shorts**

#### Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) 2023

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school excursions, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

Parents or legal guardians are required complete a CSEF application form and lodge it with the Office for processing.

Application forms should be completed and lodged with **schools by Monday 27th February 2023**, as payments are made from March. However schools will be able to accept and process applications up until the end of Term 2 each year. Contact the Office to obtain a CSEF application form.

<u>Please ensure a copy of your means-tested concession card is provided with your CSEF application form.</u> If you were eligible and received CSEF in 2022, your application will rollover to 2023 and a new application form is <u>not required</u> to be completed.


WHERE: FYANSFORD COMMON


