### **NEWS FROM MR SMITH**

Dear School Community Members,

Reading, Reading, Reading: By now all students should be into the habit of regularly engaging in a home-reading program (both independently and being read to). As parents, we have the opportunity to project and model the importance of reading onto our children. Professor Anne Bayetto, from Flinders University in South Australia, highlighted students who read:

- Less than 1 minute per day will read 8000 words a year
- 4.6 minutes per day will read 282 000 words a year
- 20 minutes per day will read 1.8 million words a year

How can they ever catch up? Our role, as teachers, is to provide the explicit reading strategies that children require to be successful readers. As parents/carers, your job is to give the opportunity for them to practise these skills. We expect all students are engaged in a regular home-reading program. Please contact your child's teacher if you require support to facilitate the home-reading program for your child.

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support Framework Matrix:

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) is a framework that teaches students a clearly defined set of expectations and behaviours. SWPBS assists schools to improve social, emotional, behavioural and academic outcomes for children and young people. Mano is 10 years into the SWPBS journey and is a key feature of our school. Attached to this newsletter is a copy of the SWPBS Matrix that outlines the key foci for each week. We highly recommend that families reinforce the weekly focus each week at home

Annual Implementation Plan: Like every school in the state, we have developed our school improvement plan that outlines our key areas the school will focus on to maximise student learning and wellbeing outcomes. The plan aligns with our strategic intent of improving student achievement, wellbeing and engagement. Our key improvement strategies for this year will be:

- Develop and implement a <u>whole school approach to health and wellbeing</u> through aligning the School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) framework, Respectful Relationships and Berry Street.
- To increase student <u>voice</u>, <u>agency</u> and <u>leadership</u> across our school.
- Implement, monitor and resource the Mano evidenced based <u>Teaching and Learning Model</u>.
- Develop and implement an <u>evidenced</u> based and whole school approach to the teaching of <u>writing</u>.

As a staff team, we are committed to achieving the targets against our improvement plan and have begun work on each of these areas. I look forward to providing our families with regular updates on our progress and achievements.

Morning Tea with our new students: I am thrilled to share with you that our seven new students to the school have settled in incredibly well. Mrs Forsyth (Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader) and I had morning tea with our new students last Friday and each student reported a successful transition to Mano. Our new students stated, "I love the sport", "STEM is my favourite part of school", "the Art room and program is so much fun", and "the Junior Playground is my favourite place at school". They also reported they found the "work harder than my last school" and "because I am shy, making friends has been tricky". We will continue to support these students to ensure their time at Mano is successful.

Thank you Parents and Friends: On behalf of the Mano community, I thank, acknowledge and applaud the work of our Parents and Friends Committee (P & F). Through the ongoing

efforts of our P & F, we raised an amazing \$33,000 in 2022 by running the following events: Colour Run, 2 x Election Day BBQ's, Mothers & Fathers Day Stalls and Trivia Night. These funds have been allocated to our Playground and Oval Upgrade program. It is through the commitment and dedication of our P & F that we will be in a position later in the year to begin planning the upgrade of our playgrounds— we look forward to keeping everyone updated.

<u>Classroom and Specialist Resources Donations:</u> We also thank our families for their support and donations to our Classroom Resources and Specialist Resources programs.

We received \$12,400 in donations for the Classroom Resources – this will fund the following items:

- Tuff Activity Trays
- AquaPlay,
- Magnetic Marble & Lego for the Preps
- Whiteboard Tables
- · Calming Cloud Chairs for the Grade 1s
- · Lockable iPad Cabinet

We received \$11,951 in donations for the Specialist Resources - this will be used to fund the following items:

- Lego Education SPIKE for STEM

Once again, thank you to all families who donated to these programs – please know your contribution will make a difference to the education of all our students.

Yes, and I go for the Western Bulldogs


#### What is your least favourite food?

#### School Council Election Ballot

Our School Council Nomination process closed on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> February. We received more parent School Council nominations than positions available, therefore the parent/guardian community have the opportunity to vote for who they want to be elected to School Council. We have 6 candidates for 5 positions.

Ballot envelopes and candidate statements will be sent home with the eldest child in the family today, Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> March.

Completed ballot forms are due back to the School Office **strictly by 4:00pm Thursday 9**<sup>th</sup> **March.** These envelopes can be returned via your child's classroom teacher.

### NAPLAN test dates for 2023: 15th to 27th March

Dear Parents of Grade 3 and Grade 5 students.

This year, NAPLAN transitions to an online assessment platform nationwide.

This will impact all the assessments during the NAPLAN period, including writing assessment for Grade 5. Grade 3 writing assessment will still be conducted on paper for 2023.

The NAPLAN assessment period is from Wednesday 15th March - Monday 27<sup>th</sup> March, 2023 with most of our assessments scheduled to be completed from 15<sup>th</sup> - 17<sup>th</sup> March.

More information will follow about NAPLAN online in the coming weeks.

To prepare for the NAPLAN Readiness period, we need your assistance to do they following actions please with the students BYOD iPad devices.

Could the following actions please be completed by <u>Monday 6th March</u>.

This will ensure your child is **ready and prepared** for the **NAPLAN Practice Assessments for the weeks ahead.** 

- **iPad Minis:** iPad Minis are not compatible with the NAPLAN browser so they can't be used. If your child has an iPad mini, please inform the classroom teacher and a *school device will be provided to your child to use.*
- IOS Update: Update your child's iPad to the latest version of IOS. A minimum IOS of 14 is required to successful download the NAPLAN Browser.

**Download the NAPLAN Locked Down Browser:** Use this link to download the NAPLAN Locked Down Browser on your child's device. This app is green for 2023 so you will know you have the correct browser. <a href="https://apps.apple.com/au/app/nap-locked-down-browser/id1086807255">https://apps.apple.com/au/app/nap-locked-down-browser/id1086807255</a> The **'Locked Down Browser'** is a secure browser designed to: - Prevent students from accessing other applications, web pages, software or hardware features and only provides access to the test player. - Prevent use of operating system commands - Disable features such as the camera, spell check, screenshot, back and power buttons. - Prevent execution in a virtual machine or virtual desktop. - Prevent the user from exiting without confirmation. Locked Down Browser Apps will not contain test content, therefore a connection to the internet will still be required in order to take the test. Your child's device will still operate exactly as normal when we are not accessing the Locked Down Browser.

Improve capacity of the iPad: Removing excess apps and photos will improve the efficiency of your child's device. You can check the storage amount of your child's device by: Clicking Settings > General > iPad Storage <a href="https://support.apple.com/en-sg/HT201656">https://support.apple.com/en-sg/HT201656</a>

- **iPad Battery charged:** iPads should be coming to school fully charged daily, however, this is essential for participating in NAPLAN. Please ensure your child's device is *fully charged* for all school days in March and especially during the NAPLAN window.
- **Headphones:** Your child requires working headphones for NAPLAN Online. Please ensure your child's headphones are working or provide a plug-in pair of ear buds/headphones for all assessments. These will need to be available from March 6<sup>th</sup> onwards. Teachers cannot spend their time trouble shooting non-working blutooth headphones so plug-in headphones are preferred. For devices that only have blutooth headphones, we ask that you check they are in efficient working order.

In preparing for NAPLAN, we have indicated the number of student owned devices. We will have a small number of devices available on the day in case of an emergency, however, we will be relying on student devices to be used and ready with the action steps completed from above as they are accounted for. Students not participating in the BYOD program will be provided with a school device.

Could all parents please complete these steps by **Monday 6<sup>th</sup> March** so your child is organised and ready for the weeks ahead for preparation.

For those with capacity issues, it may be a weekend job to clear unused apps that are impacting capacity and deleting/storing photos.

Last week students explored force through Domino Reactions. Students were able to design their own chain reaction of events using ideas such as: creating a spiral, merging one path into two and using falling towers.


