Seasons for Growth® Program: Learning to live with change and loss

Change and loss are issues that affect all of us at some stage in our lives. At Manifold Heights Primary School we recognise that when changes occur in families through death, separation, divorce and related circumstances, children may benefit from learning how to manage these changes effectively.

We are therefore offering a very successful education program called **Seasons for Growth** which will commence in **May**, **Term 2**. This program is facilitated in small groups and is based on research which highlights the importance of social support and the need to practise new skills to cope effectively with change and loss. The program focuses on issues such as self-esteem, managing feelings, problem-solving, decision-making, effective communication and support networks.

You will receive a notice in the near future with more details about the **Seasons for Growth** program. If you think your son or daughter would benefit from this we would encourage you to talk to him/her about participating in the program. Please note that it is beneficial for one sibling to attend at a time, and it is likely that this 2023 group will focus on **Grade 2 – 4** students.

Manifold Heights Primary School is pleased to be able to offer this important program and we are confident that it will be a valuable learning experience for those who wish to be involved. The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and Manifold Heights Primary School is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- · a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 8th September 2023.

We look forward to seeing Mano getting involved and raising money for this valued organisation. Thank you to our Mano Junior School Council for their hard work in preparing this fabulous event!








