Welcome to our Visitors: We warmly welcome Mr Josh Vassallo – Mr V is currently undertaking a leadership program as an aspirant Principal and part of this course is to 'shadow' a Principal.

We also welcome three Pre-Service Teachers (student teachers) to our school. We welcome Miss Daniels (Mr Quinlan's classroom), Miss Trifiletti (Miss Thomas' classroom) and Miss Major (Miss Baum's classroom). To make our visitors feel welcome and valued, please introduce yourselves as you see them around the school.

Student Learning and Student Voice: In the coming weeks, we will be conducting a survey to find out what our students think of our school. The 'Attitudes to School' survey is an annual survey for students in Grade 4, 5 and 6. The survey is conducted by the Department of Education and is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of students' were discussing some research that highlighted the huge perceptions and experience of school. Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's experience at school. All responses are anonymous. The survey will take approx. 30 minutes to complete and will be conducted during class time. The results will be reported back to the school community at the end of July.

A second chance stall will be held from 3pm-3:30pm on Friday 12th May for any swaps and last minute purchases.






