NEWS FROM MR SMITH

Dear School Community Members,

Annual Principal Conference: I, along with all principals across the state, attended the annual Principal Conference earlier in the week where we focussed on Leading Excellence in Teaching and Learning and maximising wellbeing for all students. Our keynote speakers included Professor Lea Waters and Aunty Geraldine Atkinson. Lea and Geraldine shared with us their perspectives on how we as school leaders can lead our community to better engage our students and maximise learning and wellbeing outcomes for all students. We engaged in workshops focussed on 'Engaging Students with Mathematics', as well as 'Replenishing Student and Staff Wellbeing'. Dr Lea Waters led our session on replenishing student and staff wellbeing. Dr Waters focussed on three main points, as well as some key reminders. They were:

- Wellbeing Bank Account: our wellbeing is like a bank account!
- \Rightarrow It can be boosted with deposits and it can be depleted when stressed
- Positive moments, such as playing in nature, playing board games, eating meals together, celebrating successes, story time at bed time and being together, are small deposits into our Wellbeing Bank Account
- ⇒ A healthy Wellbeing Bank Account supports us in time of stress and challenge
- ⇒ Research suggests our Wellbeing Bank Account accumulates compound interest – 1 injection (positive moment) into our account is worth 4
- Brief moments of positivity have a huge impact: playing in nature, playing board games, eating meals together, celebrating successes, story time at bed time and being together
- Families are often not aware of the impact technology and devices have on their children's quality of sleep – quality sleep is the only time our body and mind 'repairs'

I look forward to sharing other advice from Dr Waters in coming newsletters.

Capital Works Project at Mano: As a result of some ongoing challenges associated with our storm water system and drainage here at Mano, the Victorian Schools Building Authority are about to go to tender for a major upgrade of our storm water system. Whilst not all details are finalised yet, we do know that this project will take place over approx. 12 months and some of our trees will be removed to accommodate the works. A replanting scheme will be enacted and an arborist will support this aspect of the project. More details to come.

Seligman (2012) defines a sense of accomplishment as working towards and reaching your personal goals or endeavours. It is important that these goals have a sense of purpose, so that you are motivated to set out to achieve them.

This is also a perfect opportunity to build and foster resilience and perseverance through the process that you set out in order to achieve your goals.

Ways to build accomplishment:

- Create a 'To-Do' list
- Ask for some extra responsibility
- Try a 'Do It Yourself' (DIY) project at home with your family
- Learn a new skill
- Set some exercise goals (a walk a day etc.)
- Reward yourself or celebrate when you achieve your goals


Bookings for Parent Teacher Conferences are now open and will close on Monday 19th June, 4:00pm.


