Annual Implementation Plan – 2023: Our Annual Implementation Plan outlines the key areas we will focus on to maximise student learning and wellbeing outcomes. As a staff, we recently reflected on the progress of our Annual Implementation Plan. This included staff highlighting aspects of our plan that we 'have achieved', 'are working on' or 'need further focus'. Our key improvement strategies for this year have been:

- Develop and implement an <u>evidenced</u> based and whole school <u>approach</u> to the teaching of <u>writing</u>.
- Implement, monitor and resource the Mano evidenced based <u>Teaching and Learning Model</u>.
- Develop and implement a whole school approach to health

and wellbeing through aligning the <u>School Wide Positive</u> <u>Behaviour Support</u> (SWPBS) framework, Respectful Relationships and Berry Street.

 To increase student <u>voice</u>, <u>agency</u> and <u>leadership</u> across our school.

As a staff team, we are committed to achieving the targets against our improvement plan and are highly engaged in each of these areas. In the upcoming newsletters, I will provide our families with regular updates on our progress and achievements.
