Activity – Personal strengths are our positive qualities. Ask your child/ren: What are your personal strengths? What do you think are my personal strengths? Swap! Ask them to share their acts of kindness with your family.	 Activity – With your child/ren, plan to do something kind for a neighbour, friend or family member.
